The Community Foundation of Burke County announces the 2015 Community Grants Cycle. Grants allow CFBC to make grants to tax-exempt, 501(c)(3) organizations that have programs benefiting residents of Burke County.

Those interested in applying are asked to visit the CFBC website at www.cfburke-county.org, click on Grants, and read the guidelines before applying. CFBC utilizes the Foundant Online Grant Management System. All letters of intent, grant applications and required follow-up will be done online.

To apply for a grant, applicants must submit a letter of intent to CFBC before 5 p.m. on July 13.

If a proposal meets CFBC requirements and is considered to be of critical importance to the Burke County community, a grant application will be made available to the organization for completion. All grant applications must be received before 5 p.m. on July 27.

The mission of CFBC is to encourage, develop and participate in philanthropy by providing flexible giving opportunities, professional support and responsible stewardship for the benefit of donors and qualified recipients. CFBC is a vehicle through which people, families, businesses and organizations are able to create permanent, long-term funds to address a broad spectrum of community needs.
